#### Executive Summary

Hello friends,

Well, this year has certainly been different! Just like the rest of the world, we here at OVAG have had to try to make the best of a very bad situation. Who would have thought, last year, that this year, 2020, we would be dealing with a worldwide pandemic! At many past OVAG workshops we have discussed 'what if' scenarios for disease outbreaks – and here we are truly in one. Wow! Well, at least we were somewhat prepared.

Also like the rest of the world we have had to continue with our work in a virtual space. This year for the first time ever, OVAG went virtual! With the help of our co-founder Steve Unwin, our Indonesian representative Fransiska Sulistyo, and an amazing team at University of Minnesota, our OVAG Workshop 2020 was able to transition to an online platform (via Canvas hosted by University of Minnesota) and a five-day real-time workshop using Zoom.

The extensive and exhaustive online materials were made available in the Canvas OVAG 2020 platform to every person who had ever attended an OVAG workshop (since 2009) as well as many others. The live Zoom sessions had 97 participants, spanned multiple time zones, across TEN different countries. It was quite amazing! People logged into the live sessions from shared laptops and cell phones, from cozy apartments and homes to offices to zoos to sanctuaries to forests!

Our work continued virtually with a Dec 1, 2020 CoVid 19 Webinar facilitated by drh. Fransiska Sulistyo and assisted by the rest of OVAG committee. This 2 ½ -hour webinar covered a thorough review of testing capability and accuracy as well as some helpful tips and an example of protocols provided by drh. Citrakasih Nente and drh. Yenny Saraswati Jaya of Sumatran Orangutan Conservation Program. The session was followed by a lively Q & A session and was attended by 44 people including field vets, testing laboratories, academia, project managers and government personnel.

Our canvas platform as well as our OVAG Whatsapp group remains active and is providing much needed communication and assistance between participants on a daily basis. The OVAG committee continues to meet weekly to review any new developments and to continue reaching out to new partnerships in our ongoing efforts to build a more inclusive and extensive network.

We wish to thank everyone for the huge effort made in making OVAG 2020 possible!

#### 1. Epidemiology

Discussion about epidemiology of airborne pathogens, including SARS-CoV-2. Materials provided by Dr Marie McIntyre from the University of Liverpool, UK.

#### 2. Biosecurity

Discussion about the concept and measures of biosecurity in animal sanctuaries/zoos setting, mostly focused on SARS-CoV-2. Materials provided by Dr Steve Unwin from OVAG and University of Birmingham, UK.

#### 3. SARS CoV-2 and COVID-19 Discussion

Everything about the current global pandemic, introduction of the Nonhuman Primate COVID-19 Information Hub on Canvas website <https://umnadvet.instructure.com/courses/324>, as well as discussion on what can be done by the OVAG community, finalization of OVAG Specific COVID-19 Guidance. Monitored by Dr Steve Unwin, Fransiska Sulistyo (OVAG), and George Omondi (University of Minnesota).

#### 4. SARS-CoV-2 in Humans

Discussion about the most recent knowledge about the clinical signs, treatment, and epidemiology of COVID-19 in human in the US population. Material provided by Dr Jennifer Taylor-Cousar from National Jewish Health, US.

#### 5. Molecular Diagnostics

A refresher lecture about the basic of molecular diagnostics, what can and can't be done in a field situation. Material provided by Dr Reuben Sharma from Universiti Putra Malaysia.

#### 6. Enclosure Design Tool

A continuation from last year's topic, this year the EDT team has moved to a research project, investigating at the use of the EDT protocol as a pre- and post- release assessment in orangutan reintroduction. Materials provided by Dr Susannah Thorpe and Dr Jackie Chappell from University of Birmingham, UK.

#### 7. Tuberculosis in Great Apes: Investigations and Update from Africa and Asia

Discussion about the current issues and challenges in the diagnostic of Tuberculosis in great apes. A new surveillance project is about to start within the PASA community in Africa. Monitored by Siska Sulistyo and George Omondi.

#### 8. Orangutan Microbiome

A short refresher about microbiome and sharing of results from a pilot project investigating microbiome in an orangutan captive population. Materials provided by Yenny Saraswati Jaya from Sumatran Orangutan Conservation Programme (SOCP), Indonesia.

#### 9. Anesthesia in Great Apes

A back-to-basic and comprehensive lecture about anesthesia and discussion about specific anesthesia in great apes. Materials provided by Dr. Sathya Chinnadurai from St. Louis Zoo, US.

#### 10. Dentistry

A back-to-basic and comprehensive lecture about veterinary dentistry and discussion about specific dental problems / procedures in great apes. Material provided by Dr Bonnie Bloom, Texas A&M Baylor College of Dentistry, US.

#### 11. Nutrition

Discussion about designing a milk replacer formula for orphaned orangutan in sanctuaries. Materials provided by Barbara Toddes, Philadelphia Zoo, US>

#### 12. Case Studies

During this session, seven talks about medical cases and conservation issues in orangutans and other primates were presented by participants from Sintang Orangutan Center (SOC), Borneo Orangutan Survival Foundation (BOSF), and Tasikoki Wildlife Rescue Center, and Hutan/Wildlife Impact.
